## Strengthening our community

- Maintain and improve Council services for older residents, people with disabilities, parents and children, including affordable and high-quality early childhood education and care, and vibrant libraries.
- Recognise and support the 50% of Port Phillip residents who are renters.
- Retain, grow and improve Council civic services and ensure that assets and services remain publicly owned and not privatised.
- Recognise, listen to and partner with local First Nations peoples.
- Invest in new and upgrade existing social housing.
- Celebrate and support a diverse arts community and local creative industries.
- Continue to support our queer communities.
- Support efforts by civil society to address the needs of marginalised and disadvantaged residents.
- Support vibrant neighbourhood economies and strip shopping centres to ensure small and micro businesses and not-for-profits meet local needs and create local jobs.
- Improve Council efficiency and staff effectiveness by ensuring Council employees are valued and responsive.

#### Protecting our environment

- Support widespread tree planting and greening in both public and private realms, giving priority to areas of greatest need to increase biodiversity and to make us a cool, climate adapted community.
- Capture and re-use water and increase permeability across the City reducing waste and costs.
- Support community education about climate change and what can be done about it especially through the work of the Port Phillip EcoCentre.

- Promote urban planning that prioritises both positive environmental impacts and pedestrian focused streetscape amenity – including networks of parks, social gathering spaces, safe footpaths and active transport paths.
- Expand opportunities for community and street gardening, pollination corridors and promote the associated health, community building, economic and environmental benefits.
- Support residents and business to convert to renewable energy through equitably and efficiently 'electrifying Port Phillip'.
- Reduce negative traffic impacts on our neighbourhoods and connect local and neighbouring communities through accessible and sustainable active transport options.
- Re-imagine waste management and recycling to minimise waste, turn waste into a useful resource and reduce our garbage costs.

# Strengthening local democracy

- End the self-interested political divisions in Council and genuinely engage the community in setting Council directions and policies so people can participate meaningfully in making decisions for our community;
- Demonstrate sound governance and strong finances, with greater fairness in setting rates and fees.
- Constantly monitor ways to reduce wasteful spending.
- Build and maintain the marvellous community assets which make our city a great place to live and work.
- Protect our urban heritage.
- Plan for urban renewal where it is needed.
